ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- 1. Malaysia (hereinafter the Recipient) will implement the Malaysia Kigali Implementation Plan for HFC Phasedown Project - Stage I (P177789) (the Project). The Department of Environment (DOE) under the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Sustainability (NRES) is the implementing agency for the Project. The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (the World Bank), acting as an implementing agency of the Multilateral Fund (MLF) and Trustee of the Ozone Trust Fund, has agreed to provide financing to the Project, as set out in the Grant Agreement.
- 2. The Recipient will ensure that the Project is carried out in accordance with the World Bank's Environmental and Social Standards¹ (ESSs). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP) sets out a summary of the material measures and actions. This ESCP is a part of the Grant Agreement. Unless otherwise defined in this ESCP, capitalized terms used in this ESCP have the meanings ascribed to them in the Grant Agreement.
- 3. Without limitation to the foregoing, this ESCP sets out material measures and actions that the Recipient shall carry out or cause to be carried out including, as applicable, the timeframes of the actions and measures, institutional, staffing, training, monitoring and reporting arrangements, and grievance management. The ESCP also sets out the environmental and social (E&S) instruments that shall be adopted and implemented under the Project, all of which shall be subject to prior consultation and disclosure, consistent with the ESS, and in form and substance, and in a manner acceptable to the World Bank. Once adopted, said E&S instruments may be revised from time to time with prior written agreement by the World Bank.
- 4. As agreed by the World Bank and the Recipient, this ESCP will be revised from time to time if necessary during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to Project performance. In such circumstances, the Recipient through the DOE will agree to the changes with the World Bank and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through an exchange of letters signed between the World Bank and the Recipient. The Recipient shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
